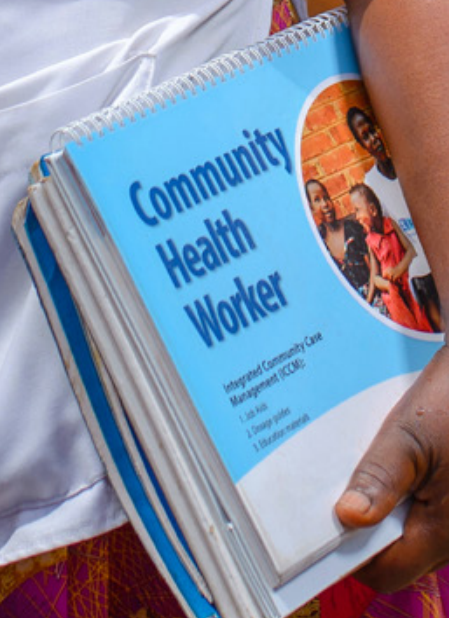

Kakenya's Dream

Through partnerships with governments, other philanthropists, and most importantly our grantees, ELMA rapidly accelerated the growth and impact of our philanthropy in 2019 and 2020.

In 2019, the primary growth areas of ELMA's philanthropy were: strengthening the health workforce; supporting mothers, caregivers, and children through the critical newborn and early childhood phases; and investing in community-based organizations, who are so often the first to respond to the needs of children and families in Africa.

While this report highlights much of the important work ELMA supported in 2019, the majority of it focuses on ELMA's and our partners' response and adaptation to COVID-19 in 2020.

The pandemic has strained already vulnerable health systems, which, with limited medical personnel and shortages of PPE and supplies, have valiantly struggled to manage surges in patients requiring critical care, while continuing to deliver routine health services. At the start of 2021, there were roughly 90 million confirmed COVID-19 cases globally, and 2 million confirmed COVID-19 deaths. The African continent had 2.3 million cases and 52,905 deaths; more than half of confirmed cases and 70 percent

of deaths were in South Africa<sup>1</sup>. These are only the confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths. Experts suggest actual COVID-19 cases and deaths may be under-reported, and the indirect impacts on the overall health system could be even more dire. For example, in South Africa, there was a 30 percent increase in maternal deaths during the 2020 lockdown, compared to the same period in 2019<sup>2</sup>.

In terms of economic and social impacts, the United Nations estimates that a further 200 million people will be forced into poverty as a result of the pandemic<sup>3</sup>. The World Bank estimates that COVID-related school closures could cause an additional 72 million primary school-age children to fall into learning poverty (cannot read or understand age-appropriate text)<sup>4</sup>. In the long-term, COVID-19-related school closures and learning loss puts this generation of students at risk of losing about USD10 trillion in future lifetime earnings, an amount equivalent to almost 10 percent of global GDP<sup>5</sup>. Already marginalized learners may fall even further behind.

To address this profound humanitarian crisis, ELMA drew on 15 years of experience investing in and with African governments, community-based organizations, universities, and non-governmental organizations to deploy over USD70 million to mitigate the direct and indirect impacts of COVID-19 on children, families, and communities across the world, primarily in Africa.

### The majority of ELMA's 2020 COVID-19 investments were made in the following areas:

**Direct COVID-19 Response** – These investments seek to control the spread of COVID-19 and mitigate its direct medical impacts on health and survival. Investments to date have supported governments' and NGO partners' emergency response efforts; protected and equipped health and community workers; developed and where possible scaled diagnostics and therapeutics; and expanded access to essential medical interventions and tools such as medical oxygen, pulse oximeters, and ventilators. Many of our investments in this area are purely emergency response, while others, such as those building the oxygen ecosystem or scaling up virtual COVID-19 and ongoing health training, are pandemic-inspired innovations to build back better systems and processes coming out of the pandemic.

**Protecting Essential Services** – These investments seek to ensure the hard-earned gains in maternal, newborn, and child health are protected during the pandemic, and that pregnant women, mothers, and their children continue to access quality antenatal, intrapartum, postnatal, early childhood, and nutritional care and support.

**Supporting Early Childhood Development (ECD) and Learning** – These investments focus on minimizing the impacts of lockdowns and school closures on ECD and learning.

**Safety Net Support for Vulnerable Communities** – These investments focus on supporting families and communities as they navigate the indirect impacts of COVID-19 on their livelihoods, incomes, food security, well-being, and safety. ELMA has prioritized the most vulnerable and marginalized, including migrants, survivors of gender-based violence, and low-income households.

## COVID-19 has confirmed and reinforced key tenets of ELMA's philanthropy.

Firstly, African children — and the families and caregivers that support them — are centered in our COVID-19 response. While we have focused extensively on the direct medical impacts of COVID-19, we also continue to ensure routine health and early childhood services are protected and are reaching the continent's most vulnerable. Secondly, no health response - whether emergency or routine - is possible without appropriately trained, supported, equipped, and remunerated health workers. From community health workers monitoring symptoms, contact tracing, and leading social distancing and hand-washing campaigns, to clinical care workers connecting COVID-19 patients to oxygen, to scientists sequencing the SARS-CoV-2 genome, people drive change. This is why the first building-block of ELMA's strategy to improve the lives of children in Africa pre-pandemic, during the pandemic, and post-pandemic, is investing in the health workforce. Thirdly, the pandemic and related lockdowns and travel restrictions demonstrated that the “fly-in, fly-out” model of development is outdated, and in fact never worked. African organizations and leadership are and always have been essential to driving crisis response, innovating for the future, and building resilient systems to prevent and withstand future catastrophes. Fourthly, the magnitude of the pandemic, which at the time of this writing is still in full force across the globe, requires multi-sectoral collaboration, and decisive and large-scale financing from people and organizations with resources to share. And finally, the pandemic demonstrated that ELMA achieves the greatest impact when we are a philanthropic partner that listens to, responds to, believes in, and backs organizations and people rooted in the communities they serve.

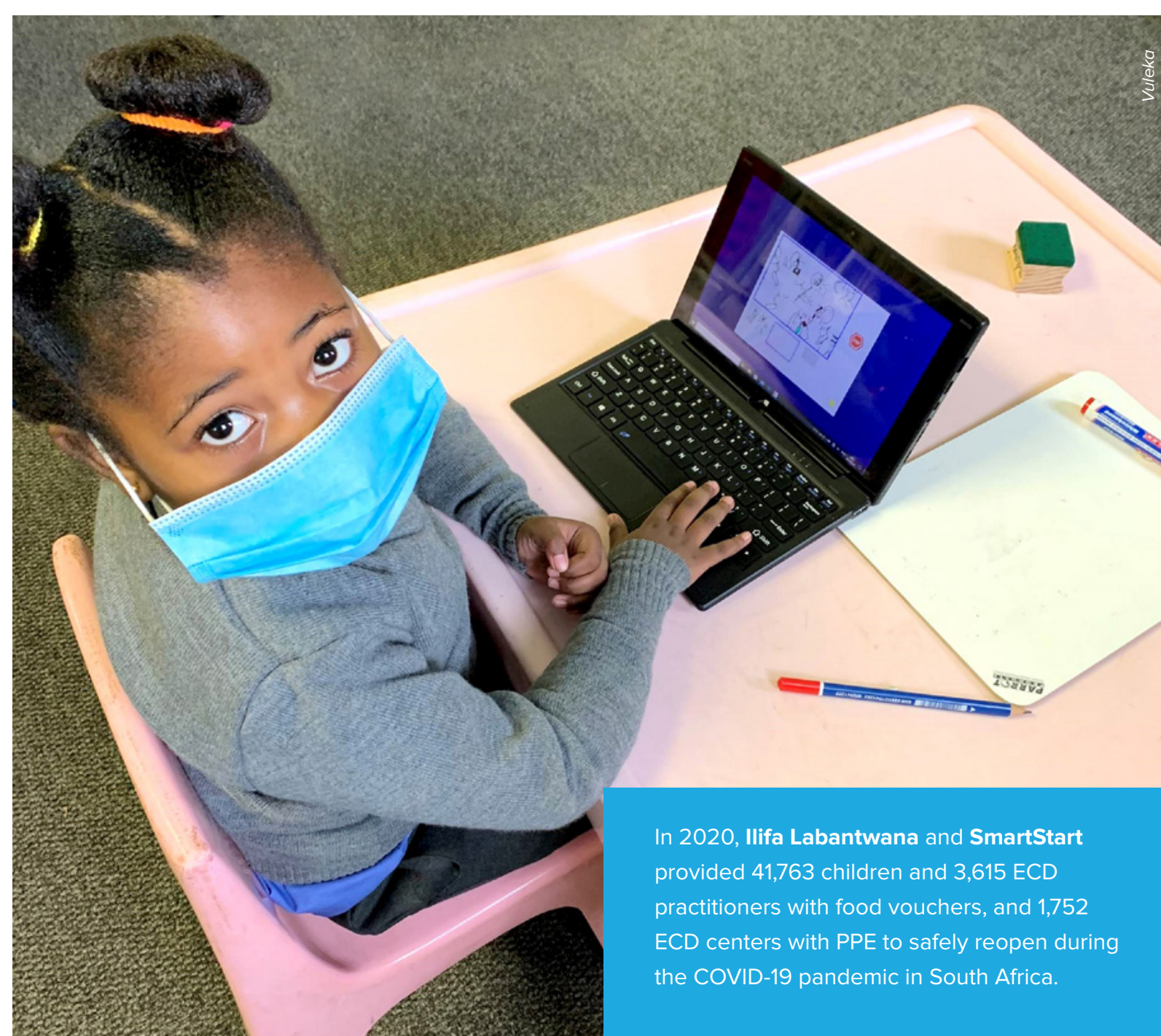

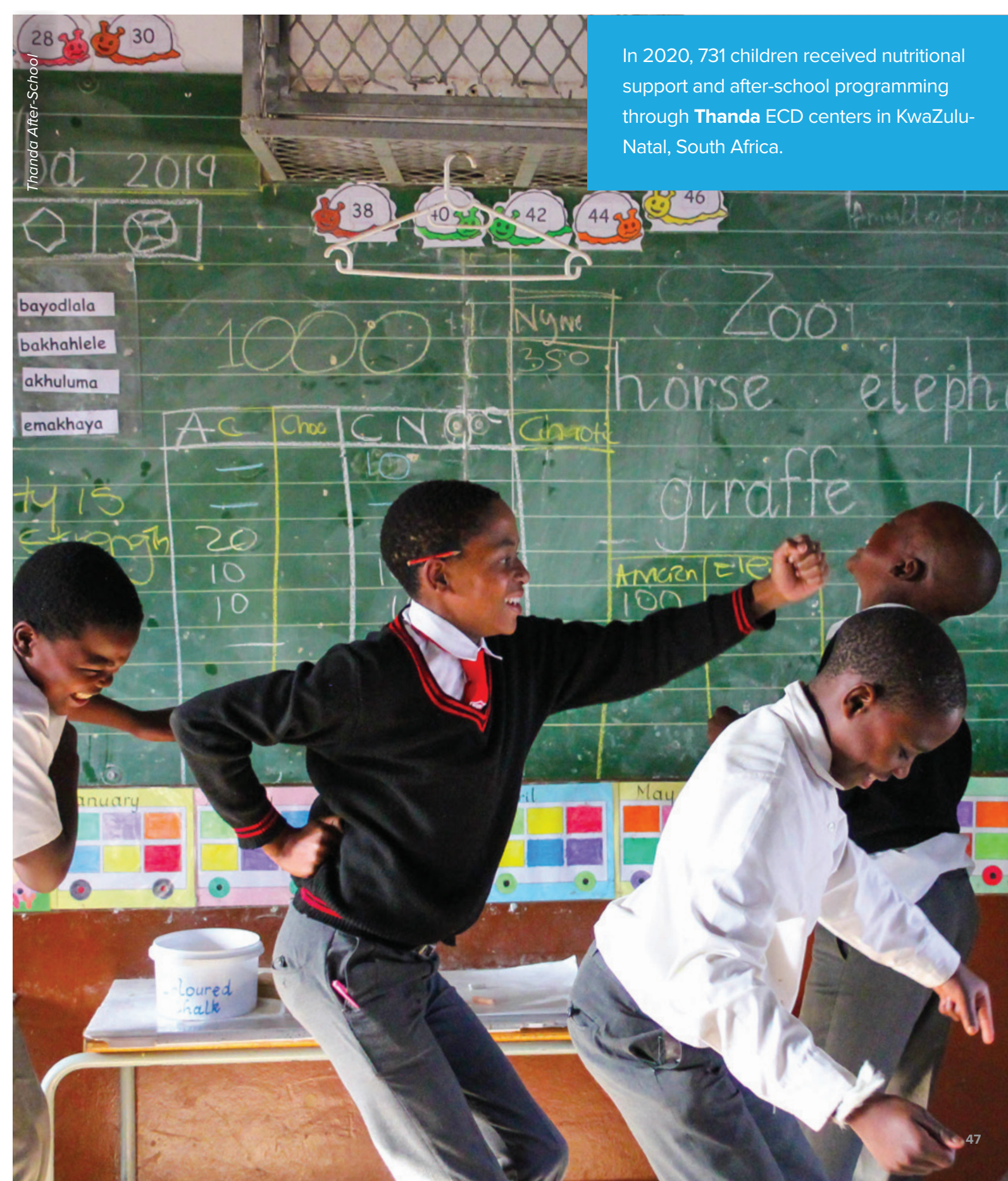

## A commitment to evidence

ELMA has an ongoing commitment to Measurement and Evaluation (M&E) in order to assess and improve the social returns on our investments. Critically, evaluations supported by ELMA focus on informing decision-making and learning — both for ELMA and the field at large — rather than on forcing accountability.

We value different forms of evaluation at different stages of a program. What is most crucial is that evaluations are “fit-for-purpose” — that is, the purpose, use, and users of an evaluation inform its design, resourcing, and timing. We believe in the judicious use of resources and prioritize the evaluation of investments that are strategically important and/or that have the potential to influence policy, funding, and practice. This in turn requires a strong commitment to using and sharing evidence generated from evaluations, as well as a process that is collaborative and consultative with internal and external stakeholders.
